Manitowoc Street Project Update:

The road construction in Reedsville is well on it's way as the ground breaking occurred on March 15th. The project, for the time being, is mostly affecting those businesses located on Manitowoc Street and the school traffic. **All businesses on Manitowoc Street are still accessible. Please do not let the construction deter you from your business and leisure activities, yet remember to use caution.**

Recommended routes for schools are as follows:

to high school office - from Hwy 10 take 4th Street South across the bridge and then park in the teacher's parking lot or on the street along side the school and walk to the Manitowoc Street main entrance.

to elementary/middle school - from Hwy 10 take 5th Street South across Manitowoc Street to Sunset Street and turn East, go right across Park Street into the school parking lot. 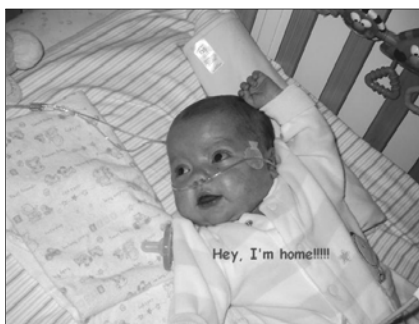

Good To Know

Cat & Dog Licenses: Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. A late fee of \$15.00 shall be assessed per dog or cat for failure to obtain a license by April 1, 2006.

Open Book: The assessment roll for the Village of Reedsville will be open for inspection on April 2, 2006 from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm in the hall of the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha Street, Reedsville, WI. To schedule a time to discuss an assessment with the Village Assessor, please contact the Village Clerk/Treasurer at 920-754-4371 during normal business hours.

Branches: Shredding is done on Tuesday. Clean woody vegetative material no greater than six inches in diameter and not less than four feet in length can be shredded. Lumber (treated and untreated), skids, and other construction and demolition waste can not be shredded. Place near curb with cut ends facing street. If you are interested in these wood chips, the pile is located near the compost area.

Compost: Yard waste, such as grass clippings, leaves, and yard & garden waste shall be disposed of by composting the material or leaving it at the Village compost site. Items NOT to be put in the compost are: stumps, roots, shrubs with intact root balls, animal waste, and sod. A sign will be erected by the compost that is ready to be used by the public.

Appliance Pick Up Dates are April 3rd and May 1st. Cost of the sticker is \$25.00 for appliances with freon and need to be purchased at the Clerk/Treasurer office during normal business hours.

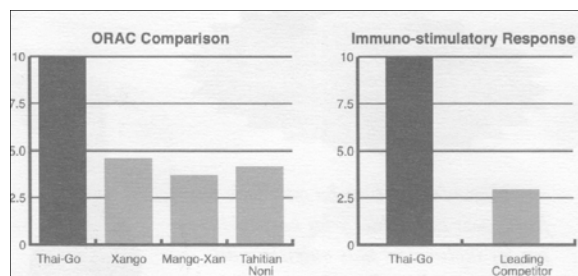

Aurora Clinic

Have you heard about the latest in cancer prevention? There is a new vaccine that helps to prevent cervical cancer. Gardasil (a series of three shots) contains four human papilloma viruses (HPV) that are responsible for 70% of cervical cancer and 90% of genital warts. Recent studies have shown that 1 in 4 females ages 14-59 are infected with HPV. The Gardasil vaccine can be given to any female age 9 to 26 years old. Vaccination against HPV would reduce a female's risk of developing cervical cancer, although it does not eliminate the need for PAP smears for cervical cancer screening. If you would like to receive this vaccine, contact your insurance company to make sure it will be covered and then call us to schedule your injection. If you do not have insurance and desire the vaccine, the drug

manufacturer has a program for free vaccines - contact us for details.

There has been a lot lately in the news about Autism. Autism is a developmental disorder that affects a person's senses and ability to communicate effectively with others. There is no known cause or cure for autism. However, with help from doctors, specialists, teachers and parents, autistic children can learn to adjust and live with this disorder. Symptoms your child may show include a loss of a skill he or she had before (at any age), the child not understanding hand gestures or body language, or the child does not pretend or play make believe games, and has a flat facial expression or uses a monotone voice. If you are worried about your child having Autism then call to schedule a screening visit.

A tetanus vaccine is needed every 10 years regardless of your age. Tetanus spores can enter the body through a wound that is contaminated with soil, dust or animal waste. Spores can get into the body through a tiny pinprick, scratch, deep puncture wounds or any size cut in the skin. Once the spores enter a wound, they produce a powerful nerve poison that spreads through the body and causes painful symptoms. The tetanus vaccine is now combined with a vaccine that helps prevent pertussis (whooping cough) for individuals under 65 years old. Call us to schedule your injection before you get injured.

USDA Rural Development Home Loan, Home Repair Loan, and Grant Program

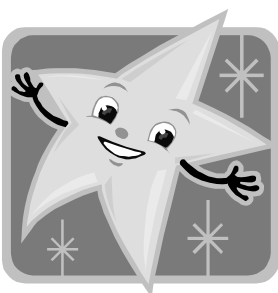
Loan assistance is available to make essential home repairs for low income homeowners and loan and grant assistance is available for elderly low income homeowners. Loan and grant funds can be used for weatherization purposes, electrical work, structural repairs, well work or other essential repairs.

Terms:

Home Repair Loan Program: One percent interest and up to a 20-year repayment period. Maximum loan amount is \$20,000.

Home Repair Grant Program: Must be repaid if the property is sold or transferred within three years of receiving the grant; otherwise, no repayment required. Maximum grant amount is \$7,500.
