## Good To Know

**Appliance Pick Up:** Dates for pick ups are May 1, and June 5. Stickers need to be purchased at the Clerk/Treasurer office during normal business hours and cost \$25.00.

**Bicycle Registration:** All bicycles must be registered. To obtain the license, flag down a Village Police Officer. A \$2.00 fee covers a one-time registration.

**Curfew:** Any person under the age of 18 unaccompanied by a parent or legal guardian may not be out and about between 11:00 PM - 6:00 AM Sunday through Thursday and 12:00 PM - 6:00 AM Friday and Saturday.

**Board of Review:** The Village of Reedsville will hold its first meeting on May 16, 2007 from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM, in the hall at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha Street, Reedsville, WI. Please contact the Clerk/Treasurer at 754-4371 for the procedural requirements if you want to appear before the Board.

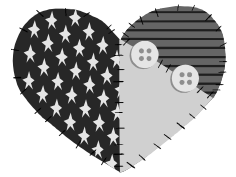
**Vehicle Nuisance:** It is illegal for any partially dismantled, non operating, wrecked, junked, unregistered or discarded vehicles to be placed or stored on any public or private property within the Village limits for a period of longer than five (5) days, unless said vehicles are stored within an enclosed building. This ordinance does not apply to property zoned for the sale or repair of vehicles. Having a vehicle behind your garage or under a tarp does not meet the requirement of an enclosed building.

**Open Burning/Fire Pits:** Controlled burning must be located off the public street pavement or street gutter, must be at least fifteen (15') from any lot line and may not be less than fifteen feet (15') from any building. Only clean wood may be used in fire pits and flames cannot extend more than two feet (2') above the pit. All fires must be monitored by a responsible person until the fire has extinguished itself completely. Persons utilizing and maintaining outdoor fires shall be responsible for any liability resulting from any damage caused by their fire.

**Reminder – Pool Owners:** You must document, in writing, the starting and ending meter readings and the dates when filling the pool to qualify for the swimming pool discount.

## **This Spring and Your Health, Remember - Allergies, Asthma, and Aurora**

Allergies are abnormal immune system reactions to things that are typically harmless to most people. When you're allergic to something, your immune system mistakenly believes that this substance is harmful to your body. (Substances that cause allergic reactions, such as certain foods, dust, plant pollen, or medicines, are known as allergens.) In an attempt to protect the body, the immune system produces antibodies to that allergen. Those antibodies then cause certain cells in the body to release chemicals into the bloodstream, one of which is histamine. The histamine then acts on your body causing an overreaction to the allergen producing symptoms. Future exposure to that same allergen will trigger this antibody response again. This means that every time you come into contact with that allergen, you'll have an allergic reaction. Common Allergy Symptoms: runny, stuffy, or itchy nose, watery eyes, sneezing, pressure in the nose and cheeks, ear fullness and popping, dark circles under the eyes, and hives.

Asthma is a disease of the lungs that causes a person to have difficulty breathing. The airways of people with asthma are extra sensitive to allergens and to other irritants in the air. Asthma symptoms start when allergens or other irritants cause the lining of the airways to swell (become inflamed) and narrow. The muscles around the airways can then spasm (contract rapidly), causing the airways to narrow even more and making it difficult for air to move through. When the lining of the airways is inflamed, it produces more mucus. The mucus clogs the airways and further blocks the flow of air. This is called an "asthma flare-up." A person having an asthma flare-up may cough, wheeze (make a whistling sound while breathing), be short of breath, and feel an intense tightness in the chest. Between flare-ups, a person's breathing can seem completely normal, or a person may continue to have some symptoms, such as coughing. Some people with asthma feel as if they are always short of breath. Other people with the condition may only cough at night or while exercising and they may never have a noticeable flare-up.

The Aurora Health Center in Reedsville is open 8:00 am to 5:00 pm daily. Call (920) 754-4337 to schedule your appointment. New patients are welcome! A health professional is available to provide comprehensive health care for individuals and families at every stage of life. Dr. Mark Hendricks's monthly clinic day is May 31<sup>st</sup>. From May 11<sup>th</sup> to May 18<sup>th</sup> there may not be a health professional available. The phones will be answered to assist you in obtaining medical attention. The clinic will be open for lab draws, free blood pressure checks, immunizations, and to schedule future appointments but will be closed from 12-1pm during this week. Appointments for medical care will resume on May 21<sup>st</sup> at 8:00 am.

## Where Did It Go?

During the past few months questions have been asked about the Reinemann warehouse formerly located on 6th Street in Reedsville. The structure was built in the mid 1800's for the purpose of storing bagged and bulk grain. When additional storage was no longer needed, the building was offered to anyone wanting to develop it for historical purposes.

Alpine Timber from DePere expressed interest on behalf of a local developer who was interested in including such a building in an historical development in the area. An agreement was reached and dismantling of the old flour mill began in late February 2006. Every board was removed, marked, and documented before it was carefully stacked, and eventually transported to the site where it would be reconstructed once again. Beams and timbers from the original structure will frame the building, and original boards will become the flooring.

Now the 150 year old granary is about to come back to life as the newest old-looking building at the Olde School Square, located on Cty Hwy G and Creamery Road in Ledgeview. Upon completion, it will become a four story office building that will be home to Renard's Capital Asset Management Group and other businesses and retail. This development is centered around the former East River Valley No. 5 School, and will be one of the first fiber-optic business parks in Northeastern Wisconsin.

An open house has been scheduled for May 5th, 11am-4pm. Anyone interested in touring the reconstructed building is welcome to attend. The open house event celebrates the completion of the Historic Reedsville Granary building and the Creamery Ice House as well as to welcome the new business's Jakubovsky Chiropractic, Paint The Star's Children's Art Studio and The Cutting Garden to the Olde-School Square complex. Additionally open for everyone to tour will be The Cooking Cupboard, Bonnie Lee & Associates, Essential to Wellness and Strike Team Technologies. Olde-School Square is located just south east of Green Bay in the town of Ledgeview and is accessible via highways 43 or 41/141 by taking 172 and exiting on GV, then head south to Dickinson Road and West to the Olde-School House or; peddle or walk along the East River Trail to the south end right by the park.

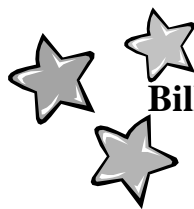
