

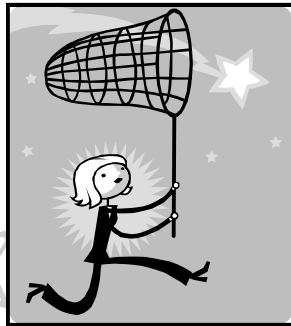

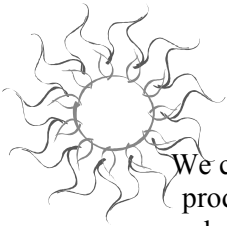

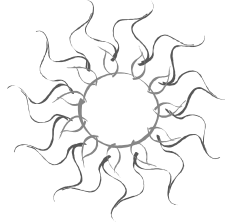

FRIENDS OF ST. PATRICK PLAN HARVEST PICNIC

The Friends of St. Patrick's 6th Annual Old Fashioned Harvest Picnic is scheduled for Sunday, September 14th starting with an outdoor mass at St. Patrick's Heritage Park, Maple Grove, at 11:00 A.M. This is the 140th anniversary of the St. Patrick Historical Building. The corner stone reads November 1868. The first mass was offered in the church on Christmas Eve of 1868. The building of the large brick church began in 1866, with farmers hauling the brick from Manitowoc by wagons pulled by oxen teams. Prior to this new church, a wooden church building was used which was later converted to the first Catholic school in the parish.

Maple Grove is located at the intersection County Tr. G and Taus Rd. The event will include kids games, adult games, a group of young Irish dancers, the Sisters' Kitchen full of sweets and goodies, a silent auction, chicken booyah, brats, hamburgers, hot dogs, refreshments, fresh produce, and Amish breads. An old car show will also be taking place on the grounds. There will be musical entertainment by, The Jerry Krueger Band. This year a new Sport Scooter will be raffled off at approximately 3:30 p.m. This European style scooter will get approximately 100 miles per gallon, and can travel at speeds over 40 miles per hour. Polls will be open at the Reedsville Municipal Building, 217 Menasha St., from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm.

Voter Registration Information: The Village of Reedsville asks voters to bring their Drivers License (if you do not have a Drivers License, please bring your Social Security card) with them to the polling place on if you have not already registered. The federal Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) and Wisconsin State Statutes require all voters in Wisconsin to be registered in order to vote after January 1, 2006. Flu season right around the corner

Aurora Health Care will once again offer the influenza vaccine this year, and I encourage everyone to be immunized.

Influenza (the flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by two types of influenza virus: types A and B. Influenza can lead to severe cases of pneumonia or even death. Symptoms of Influenza A or B include fever, body aches, shortness of breath, cough, fatigue or a raw feeling in the chest. Some people describe the onset of flu like they have been 'hit by a truck.' Many people think of the flu as vomiting and diarrhea but those symptoms are usually gastroenteritis or the stomach flu. These illnesses are different from the respiratory flu virus that we immunize against.

Influenza activity in the United States is most common between December and March—with February usually as the highest peak of influenza infection. But, patients are encouraged to get their shots as soon as they are available in October, because it takes about two weeks after vaccination for antibodies to provide protection against the influenza virus.

Since influenza strains change from year to year, it is necessary to be vaccinated annually. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has changed all three strains this year. The vaccine contains a 'dead' virus, so people cannot get the flu from a flu shot.

A flu shot is the most effective way to protect yourself from influenza and its potentially dangerous complications. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), five to 20 percent of the U.S. population gets the flu and there are approximately 36,000 deaths and 226,000 hospitalizations caused by influenza each year.

An annual flu shot is recommended for:

- Children between the ages of 6 months and 18 years.
- Adults 50 years of age or older.
- Women who will be pregnant during flu season.
- Anyone with long-term health problems or a weakened immune system.
- Anyone with muscle or nerve disorders that can lead to breathing or swallowing problems.
- Residents of nursing homes and other chronic-care facilities.
- Health care personnel.
- Household contacts and caregivers of children from birth to 5 years of age, with particular emphasis on vaccinating contacts of children less than 6 months of age.
- Household contacts and caregivers of people 50 years and older, and those who are at risk of serious complications from influenza.
- People who provide essential community services.
- People living in residence halls or other crowded conditions.
- People who travel to the Southern hemisphere between April and September or in organized tourist groups at any time.

People who have severe allergy to chicken eggs or who have had a severe reaction to an influenza vaccination should not be vaccinated without first consulting their health care provider.

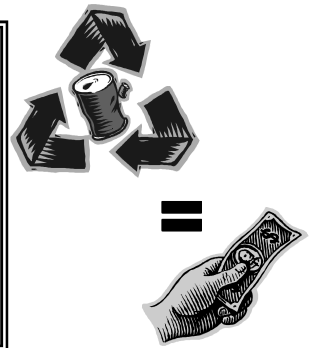
A pneumonia vaccine also is available and recommended for people ages 65 or older and those people under age 65 with chronic health conditions such as diabetes or heart and lung diseases.

FIBROMYALGIA - what is it and how to help.

The term fibromyalgia comes from the Latin word *fibra* (fiber) and the Greek words *myo* (muscle) and *algos* (pain). Fibromyalgia refers to a condition involving chronic pain in the muscle fibers. Researcher Muhammad Yunus, M.D. of the University of Illinois College of Medicine, views fibromyalgia as being part of a larger spectrum of conditions, which he calls Dysregulation Spectrum Syndrome (DDS). Since medical science has not determined an exact cause of FMS or other conditions associated with DDS, and since FMS is essentially unheard of in third world countries, we can deduce that it probably has its roots in our modern diet and lifestyle.
