## Good to Know from the Village Hall

**Christmas Tree Pick-up** is scheduled for Saturday, January 5, 2008. This is being done by the Reedsville Betterment Club. If you have a question or would like to assist with this, please contact Leroy or Judy Stahl.

**Payment of Property Taxes:** Real Estate and personal property tax payments can be made in person at the Reedsville Municipal Building during normal business hours. Payments may also be made by sending a check to the following: Reedsville Municipal Building, Tax Collection, 217 Menasha St., Reedsville, WI 54230-8597. **A receipt will be sent back only if you have included a self-addressed stamped envelop.** All first installment taxes are due by January 31, 2008. The Village appreciates all taxes be paid by check or money order made payable to the Village of Reedsville.

**Cat & Dog Licenses** are due on or before April 1, 2008. Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. **Please make out a separate check for the licenses as it goes into a different account.**

**Snow & Ice Removal:** The owner or occupant of any lot abutting on a public sidewalk shall clear their sidewalk of snow within twenty-four (24) hours after a snowfall and keep the same free of ice. If such snow or ice is not removed as required herein, the Street Commissioner shall cause the same to be done and the cost thereof assessed against the property owner pursuant to Sec. 66.60(16), WI Stat.

### **Clerk/Treasurer's Office Hours:**

Monday thru Thursday, 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM  
and Friday, 8:00 AM to 1:00.

**Winter Parking Restrictions:** No person shall park any vehicle on any street or alley in the Village between two-thirty (2:30) AM to six (6) AM of any day from November 1 to April 1, unless permission to do so is received from the Police Department. **You must obtain permission each year**, so if you had permission for last winter (2006/2007), you must obtain permission for this winter (2007/2008). **Even with permission**, vehicles may not be parked on any street or alley when we receive snow. Lack of vehicles on streets and alleys allow the Village employees to clean up in a more timely fashion. If you have question on this, please contact the Reedsville Police Dept.

## **NURSE PRACTITIONER TO LEAD AURORA HEALTH CENTER IN REEDSVILLE**

Advanced Practice Nurse Practitioner Denise Brilliant will lead Aurora Health Center in Reedsville starting on January 7, 2008. Brilliant, a native to Manitowoc County is looking forward to providing primary care needs to residents in the Reedsville area. "I'm happy to be able to give back to Manitowoc County residents, especially since this is where I live," said Brilliant. "I believe in helping people reach their optimal level of health and providing them with options and education they need to achieve the goals."

Aurora Health Center in Reedsville will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8 a.m. to noon on Fridays. Same-day appointments will be available. The clinic offers primary care, preventive care and immunizations for children and adults. X-rays, blood tests and urine analysis can be taken at the clinic as well as in office rapid results for tests such as pregnancy, strep throat and mononucleosis.

Brilliant has 27 years of nursing experience, with 12 years as a family nurse practitioner. She has been with Aurora Health Care for more than 2 years.

Prior to practicing as a nurse practitioner, she earned a master's degree in nursing from the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh. She received her nursing undergraduate degree from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Also on staff are Sharon Wondrash, L.P.N. and Dianna Bonin, L.P.N.

Patients of the Reedsville clinic will benefit from Aurora Health Care's electronic medical records system.
