Happy New Year Village of Reedsville Notes from the Village Hall

Effective Immediately: The hauler and route has changed for picking up garbage/recycling. Please have items on the curb by 7:00 am. **Holiday pick up** will continue to be delayed to Saturday; however, items will be picked up earlier. Please have items on the curb the night before.

Garbage Collection during the holidays will be Friday, December 23, 2011 and **Saturday**, December 31, 2011.

Recycling Pick-Up: January 13th & 27th

Payment of Property Taxes: Real Estate and personal property tax payments can be made in person at the Reedsville Municipal Building during normal business hours. Payments may also be made by sending a check to the following: Reedsville Municipal Building, Tax Collection, 217 Menasha St., Reedsville, WI 54230-8597. **A receipt will be sent back only if you have included a self-addressed stamped envelop.** All first installment taxes are due by January 31, 2012. The Village appreciates all taxes be paid **by check or money order** made payable to the Village of Reedsville

Cat & Dog Licenses are due on or before April 1, 2012. Unspayed females and unneutered males are \$10.00 each. Spayed females and neutered males are \$5.00 each. You must show proof of a valid rabies shot. **Please make out a separate check for the licenses as it goes into a different account.**

Clerk/Treasurer's Office Hours: Monday thru Thursday, 8:00 am to 3:00 pm and Friday, 8:00 am to 1:00 pm.

Snow & Ice Removal: The owner or occupant of any lot abutting on a public sidewalk shall clear their sidewalk of snow within twenty-four (24) hours after a snowfall and keep the same free of ice. If such snow or ice is not removed as required herein, the Street Commissioner shall cause the same to be done and the cost thereof assessed against the property owner pursuant to Sec. 66.60(16), WI Stat.

Christmas Tree Pick-up is scheduled for Saturday, January 7, 2012. This is being done by the Reedsville Betterment Club. If you have a question or would like to assist with this, please contact Leroy or Judy Stahl.

Nomination Papers for Village Trustee can be picked up at the Clerk/Treasurer's office during normal business hours. The completed forms need to be returned on or before January 3, 2012.

Utility Bill Payment Service: You can now use your credit card (MasterCard, Visa, American Express or Discover) or your Amazon Payments or PayPal account to pay your utility bill.

The Village of Reedsville has partnered with *Wisconsin Payments* for this service. All payments using this service are done on a PCI compliant network and no information is ever stored on any server.

Wisconsin Payments charges a convenience fee of 3.5% plus \$1.00 for each payment made using their site.

How Can I Get Home Delivered Meals?

Manitowoc County offers a wonderful service to eligible individuals that many may not be aware of, Home Delivered Meals. Home Delivered Meals are available anywhere in the county. Eligibility guidelines are as follows:

- A person aged 60 years of age or older who is frail and essentially homebound (does not leave home under normal circumstances, flexibility is allowed for appointments), or a spouse of an eligible person regardless of age or condition.
- A disabled individual who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program.
- The person is unable to participate in the congregate meals program because of physical or emotional problems.

There is no spouse or other adult living in the same house or building willing to prepare meals and the individual is unable to physically or emotionally obtain food and prepare adequate meals.

Meals are available to all qualifying individuals on a donation basis regardless of income. For more information about eligibility and how to get signed up please feel free to call the

Adopt-A-Hydrant

The winter months bring a special concern to the Reedsville Fire Department. Winter snowfall with the plowing of snow can often hide fire hydrants under a large amount of snow making them difficult to find quickly. In the event of a fire, firefighters have to locate and shovel out fire hydrants before hooking up to them. Precious time is lost. Please don't let your neighborhood fire hydrant remain "undercover".

The hydrants are normally cleaned out by the Village Street Department, but due to budget and time restraints it can go several days before being cleaned out. We are asking that you help protect yourself and your neighbor by "adopting" the fire hydrant closest to your residence or business and keep it clear of snow.

We need a 3 foot clearance on all sides. When shoveling snow please be aware of vehicle traffic. Do not stand in the street and be careful not to slip and fall out into the roadway.

If you notice a hydrant that needs to be cleaned out, and are unable to "adopt" it, please contact the Village Street Department at 754-4371, so they can take care of it.

Smokey is a 17 year old registered quarterhorse and was donated to Sunrise Horse Farm by Curt, Pat, & Melissa Holman. This is what Pat had to say about Smokey's life at the Holman's:

Smokey came into Melissa's life after being owned by a very busy teenager. Melissa had been riding horses, taking lessons and attending horse camps for about 4 years when a friend called us about ownership. Smokey had a big personality and his own ideas from the first day we met him. He wanted to lead in the circle pen and wasn't all that crazy about being ridden and told what to do. But he loved to be brushed and fed and fussed over. After getting to know Smokey and how to care for him at our friend's barn, Smokey moved to our acreage in the spring of 2005. Smokey and Charmer moved into a new barn and fenced area built by Melissa's dad, Curt. For two years both horses kept us all happy and busy; riding, caring for, and modifying the area for them to try new things. Smokey seemed more like a curious dog than a horse to my husband who made many additions and repairs to the barn and fenced area. During one fence redo, Smokey even helped himself to a cold Miller Lite that Curt was enjoying. (We later found out that beer can indeed, be helpful to the digestive system of a horse!) Late in 2007, as Melissa became too busy with high school, a part-time job at Target, and extra-curricular activities we found excellent homes for Smokey and Charmer. Smokey has been living with Mary Ellen Kiel at Sunrise Horse Farm, and Charmer is enjoying life on a family farm in Brillion.

Some of the other comments about Smokey: He has to know what is going on at all times, he sticks his tongue out and makes everyone laugh, he rattles the metal gate to get your attention, and lets you know that he hasn't been fed yet. Smokey is indeed a curious horse and loved by everyone that comes to Sunrise Horse Farm.

On November 27, we had a Sunrise family gathering and made Christmas cards for the soldiers in Iraq. About 3:30 that afternoon, we had a surprise visit from Santa Claus who had a present for everyone. A fun time was had by all.
