Do Not Miss the Headlining Act at this Year's Community Under the Stars

This June 2nd, you are going to want to enjoy some delicious supper while you listen to the sweet blue-grass picking of the Sub-Atomic Ramblers, out of Two Rivers. They are just the warm up to a rocking evening of superb music and dancing. Copper Box, based in Oshkosh, WI, is the master of "accordion-swamp-rock." They will be performing a double feature for the Reedsville Community Under the Stars – Packerland Ride event. Their music has a variety of root influences such as: Cajun, country, rock, polka, Zydeco, blues, and Tex-Mex, that is infused with "pure and raw" emotion. Copper Box's mission is to bring people together and to have a good time as they watch and listen to a band that loves to perform and make music. Known for their remarkable live shows, Copper Box blends roots rock, polka, country and a healthy taste of Zydeco into what has become their own trademark sound. Some describe front man, Danny Jerabek, as "the Jimi Hendrix of the accordion." Inspired by his grandfather to learn Czech and German songs and later inspired by Don Cialkoszewski ("The Polish Kid"), the great Steve "Esteban" Jordan, and a love for a diverse range of music from jazz to rock and everything in between, Danny Jerabek has made a name for himself in the world of accordion greats. Danny shares lead vocals with his other half, Michelle Jerabek (wash board, saxophones and percussion), who's amazing voice and outstanding musical talent steal the show. The rhythm section consists of Kevin Junemann (bass), and Jason Van Ryzin (drums). They have shared the main stage at festivals across the nation with artists like, The Little River Band, Buckwheat Zydeco, Little Feat, Brave Combo, The Radiators, Lou Gramm, Marcia Ball, C.J. Chenier, W.C. Clark, The Clumsy Lovers, etc. They have also received regular rotations on countless college radio stations and public radio and continue to win faithful fans that will travel hours to see them perform. **Be sure to catch them at Community Under the Stars, June 2nd, noon-2pm and 6-8pm at the Village of Reedsville Firefighters Park.**

Skin cancer awareness brought to you by Aurora Health Care - Reedsville

Where is skin cancer most likely to occur?

Most skin cancers occur on parts of the body that are repeatedly exposed to the sun. These areas include the head, neck, face, tips of the ears, hands, forearms, shoulders, back, chests of men, and the back and lower legs of women.

What are the risk factors for skin cancer?

A number of things may put you at higher risk of having skin cancer some day: having fair skin, red or blond hair; having light-colored eyes; sunburn easily; having many moles, freckles or birthmarks; working or playing outside; being in the sun a lot as a child; having had a serious sunburn; having family members with skin cancer; tanning in the sun or with a sunlamp

Signs of skin cancer ABCDE rule

A for asymmetry: A mole that, when divided in half, doesn't look the same on both sides

B for border: A mole with edges that are blurry or jagged

C for color: Changes in the color of a mole, including darkening, spread or loss of color, or the appearance of multiple colors (blue, red, white, pink, purple, gray)

D for diameter: A mole larger than 1/4 inch in diameter

E for elevation: A mole that is raised above the skin and has an uneven surface

Other signs include: A mole that bleeds, a fast-growing mole, a scaly or crusted growth on the skin, a sore that won't heal or a mole that itches

How can I prevent skin cancer?

The key is to avoid being in the sun or using sunlamps. If you're going to be in the sun for any length of time, wear clothes made from tight-woven cloth so the sun's rays can't get through to your skin, and stay in the shade when you can. Wear a wide-brimmed hat to protect your face, neck and ears. Remember that clouds and water won't protect you--60% to 80% of the sun's rays can get through clouds and can reach swimmers at least one foot below the surface of the water.

Tips on preventing skin cancer

Avoid the sun, especially from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., when the sun's rays are the strongest; don't use tanning booths or sunlamps; wear protective clothing and hats; check your skin yourself every month for signs of skin cancer; if you see an area on your skin that looks unusual, ask your health care provider about it.

How should sunscreen be used?

Use sunscreens with a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or more. Put the sunscreen everywhere the sun's rays might touch you, including your ears, the back of your neck and bald areas of your scalp. Put more on every hour if you're sweating or swimming.

Happy Father's Day, Dad!



Father's Day, contrary to popular misconception, was not established as a holiday in order to help greeting card manufacturers sell more cards. In fact when a "father's day" was first proposed there were no Father's Day cards! Mrs. John B. Dodd, of Washington, first proposed the idea of a "father's day" in 1909. Mrs. Dodd wanted a special day to honor her father, William Smart. William Smart, a Civil War veteran, was widowed when his wife died in childbirth with their sixth child. Mr. Smart was left to raise the newborn and his other five children by himself on a rural farm in eastern Washington state. It was after Mrs. Dodd became an adult that she realized the strength and selflessness her father had shown in raising his children as a single parent.

The first Father's Day was observed on June 19, 1910 in Spokane Washington. At about the same time in various towns and cities across American other people were beginning to celebrate a "father's day." In 1924 President Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a national Father's Day. Finally in 1966 President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the 3rd Sunday of June as Father's Day.

Father's Day has become a day to not only honor your father, but all men who act as a father figure. Stepfathers, uncles, grandfathers, and adult male friends are all honored on Father's Day.

Biker Route determined for your viewing enjoyment.

Here is the parade route for the Packerland Ride entrance and exit journey through the Village of Reedsville. The 800-1500 bikes will arrive at noon, traveling in two packs separated by a five minute gap to alleviate the traffic stopping for a longer period of time. They will travel west on Hwy 10 to Manitowoc Street, immediately going right onto Mill Street. From there they will proceed west on Mill Street to Fifth Street and turn left. They will travel along Fifth Street until they turn left onto Deerview Street. Deerview Street intersects with Park Street and the bikes will park in the road all the way down Park Street and on Green Meadow Drive. Optimum viewing of the parade of bikes entering the Village will be on Mill Street and Fifth Street.

When the bikes reach their pit stop destination, Reedsville's Firefighters Park, the bikers and the public will enjoy the eclectic music of Copper Box, food provided by the non profit organizations of Reedsville, activities and games, a live auction with Channel 5's Tom Zalaski, a 50/50 raffle, and tons of fun.

The Packerland Ride exit will occur at 2:15pm, south on Fifth Street to Menasha Avenue. The group will turn left on Menasha and follow the road to Cty Hwy W. The Harleys will then take a right onto Cty Hwy W and follow the scenic highway back to Green Bay. Optimum viewing of the bikes exit would be Fifth Street and Menasha Avenue.

The public is welcome to this festive event celebrating the community of Reedsville and the Green Bay H.O.G. Packerland Ride involvement in raising money for the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA). The Packerland Ride is northeast Wisconsin's largest fund raiser for the MDA. Two hours of celebration and family entertainment is not enough for the Village of Reedsville; the community will be celebrating their annual event, "Community Under the Stars", throughout the day with food, kids games and crafts, free horse rides, the Reedsville Marketplace, and the evening entertainment of the Sub-Atomic Ramblers, a blue grass duo, performing at 4pm and Copper Box back for a repeat performance at 6pm.
