Village Board Meeting Changed: Due to the holiday the Reedsville Village Board meeting will be held at 6:30 PM on Tuesday, September 4..

Reminder – Pool Owners: You must document, in writing, the starting and ending meter readings and the dates when filling the pool to qualify for the swimming pool discount. All readings **must be in the Clerk-Treasurer's office but September 15, 2007** to qualify for the 2005 pool discount.

Refuse/Recyclable Pick-up: Due to the Labor Day Holiday, refuse and recyclables will be picked up on **Saturday, Sept. 8, 2007.**

New Sewer Volume Charge will go into effect June 20, 2008. The Village Board increased the sewer volume charge 3% (\$6.84 to \$7.05 per 1,000 gallons). This increase was necessary to offset increases in operating expenses and maintain the current level of service. The last volume charge increase was on December 20, 1998.

After four consecutive years of deficit spending, the 2006-2007 fiscal year ended with a modest surplus.

How did this happen? There are three major reasons:

1. The difference in the numbers between those entering the district and those leaving, under the Open Enrollment Program, was smaller than anticipated, thus saving a considerable amount.
 2. Transfers of expenditures within the special education portion of the budget resulted in additional savings.
 3. Reductions in expenditures made over the last three years have finally made a positive impact on the budget.

Mud Creek Restoration Project

Some of you may have noticed something different with the creek this year. As suggested by the DNR, in attempt to reintroduce native plant species and restore beauty to the creek shoreline, we are adopting a no mow policy for the creek shoreline and creek bed. This is done to stop creek shoreline erosion thus widening the creek and lowering water levels. It is also done to maintain the wildlife and native plant species in the area. Mowing the shoreline and creek bed only leaves dead debris in the water, promotes soil erosion, and does not let the native water and shoreline plants complete their life cycle to seed and return year after year. We appreciate your patience as it is a process that will take several years to complete, but only a few years to see positive results.
